'It's all happening at the MCG!'

Although it's the catchcry of cricket commentator Bill Lawry and not intended for schools, we're about to enter a period at Encounter that might mean this phrase is the perfect fit.

Earlier this week we confirmed two major building projects to commence within weeks: our Middle School Learning Centre on Block 69 and a purpose-built Early Learning Centre.

The Middle School space will house a science lab, visual arts room, a kitchen and a digital technologies studio. This entire space will be able to function discreetly or collaboratively, while also lending itself to transitioning readily between indoors and the outdoor environment that we'll have at our fingertips. Our Early Learning Centre will double our current capacity for early learners and will also be a space that is innovative and aligned with our emerging pedagogy to best support pre-school children.

Our expectation is that both of these projects will conclude in the opening weeks of 2024 and I am so excited to share this news with you.

In the months ahead we will also construct a roadway through Block 69 to give us a second exit point for the College, along with two demountable buildings being established to better cater for Middle & Senior School Performing Arts and our Out of School Hours Care service.

All of these changes will have a short and long term impact on our car parking and traffic flow, so I thank you in advance for being patient and understanding there is a bigger picture in mind. We will communicate any changes to you with as much notice as possible and welcome any feedback as we introduce them.

Having overseen a great deal of change at Encounter over the past decade, it seems surprising to declare that the next 12 months may 'take the cake'. Although there will be inevitable challenges as we navigate the months ahead, I am confident all of what we are doing is in the best interests of the Encounter family and I'm grateful to be leading our College through such an exciting phase.

I hope you share my immense excitement for our future.

JUNIOR SCHOOL NEWS

Connecting

Interacting with students must be the best part of my job! Whether it's helping them put up a tent at camp, reading our littlest learners a story or as I did today, speaking to the Year 5's as part of their 'Living Libraries', nothing beats spending time with the students in the Junior School. It is such a privilege to witness their learning unfold as they make connections, draw conclusions, wonder about, explore further and test their growing understandings.

At the moment, Year 5's are learning about resilience and things that contribute to positive mental health and wellbeing. They heard about a range of issues to do with this from some visiting 'experts', including Pastor Riley Smith about spirituality, from Donna about healthy eating and from me about the importance of managing screen time.


In regard to screen time, according to the Australian Institute of Family Studies, 4–5 years old children average more than two hours of screen time per weekday. By 12–13 years old, this has doubled to more than four hours per weekday and almost five hours a day on weekends.

This means that up to 30% of a child's waking time is spent in front of a screen!

This same study also found that children who engage in physical activities that they enjoy will tend to spend less time in front of screens.

The concern about children spending so much time on screens has become so extreme that Richard Louv (child advocacy expert) has named the crisis 'nature deficit disorder'. His concern is that our children just aren't getting outside enough and therefore not getting the benefit being in an outdoor learning environment provides.

Latest research does show us that children who spend time outside achieve more academically, have great wellbeing, are more attentive and less anxious than children who spend their time on screens.



One of the things our students DO have lots of opportunity to do, is utilise outdoor spaces. This term, the Year 6's have been spending a whole day down on the Block. Teachers have reported better behaviour, calmer students, more engaged learning, more output in terms of work and improved relationships with each other.
