Fiction

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." - Romans 15:13 (NIV)

Have you read a good book lately? Once, my reading was all non-fiction focused. I thought I was reading to learn new things and had completely overlooked the importance of fiction.

A few years ago I set myself the challenge to read a fiction book a week to curb my lazy scrolling habits. It didn't take long to see that reading fiction benefitted me far more than simply reducing mindless scrolling.

I'm struck over and over at the hope found in fiction. The little escape from the chaos of everyday life means that fiction creates the space for us to see and experience the hope in difficult situations.

And the best part? Fiction gives us a safe place to process our emotions and fears and to imagine situations that may or may not play out in our real lives. We are then prepared to face life with greater wisdom, resilience and most importantly, empathy, because we've shared emotions with characters in our books.



I also love that characters in fiction show us that hope isn't just wishful thinking. I love that fiction highlights that there are always bigger, more significant things at play waiting to unfold and I appreciate that quiet knowing that when things seem tough, we read fiction with a hopefulness that all will, somehow, be ok.

A final thought on fiction is that it can mirror the redemptive themes found in the Gospel—themes of love, forgiveness, and the promise of a new beginning. These parallels remind us that God's story of grace is interwoven into every aspect of our lives, even the stories we read for enjoyment.

Take a break from reality and enjoy the gift that fiction gives us to nurture our outlook on life.
