# SACE requirements

## ● Compulsory subjects requiring a C grade or higher:

- Personal Learning Plan - 10 Credits
- Literacy - 20 Credits (English Literary Studies/English/Essential English) teacher recommendation
- Numeracy - 10 Credits (Mathematics Essential/General/Methods)
- Research Project / Activating Identities and Futures – 10 Credits

## ● At least 200 Credits:

- 130 Stage 1 Credits
- 70 Stage 2 Credits





# Year 11 - Stage 1

- Compulsory subjects: English, Mathematics = 40 credits
- Christian Studies (Spiritualities, Religion and Meaning Stage 1) – 1 semester = 10 credits
- 6 elective subjects = 60 credits
- PLP and Workplace Practices = 20 credits (completed in Year 10)
- Total Stage 1 credits = 130

Four Subjects (20 credits each)



Research Project / Activating Identities and Futures (10 credits) - must achieve at least a "C" grade (will be complete by end Year 11)



Total Stage 2 credits = 90



ATAR (university entrance) requires 90 Stage 2 credits



SACE completion (no ATAR) requires 70 credits



Begins in Year 11 - set up for success

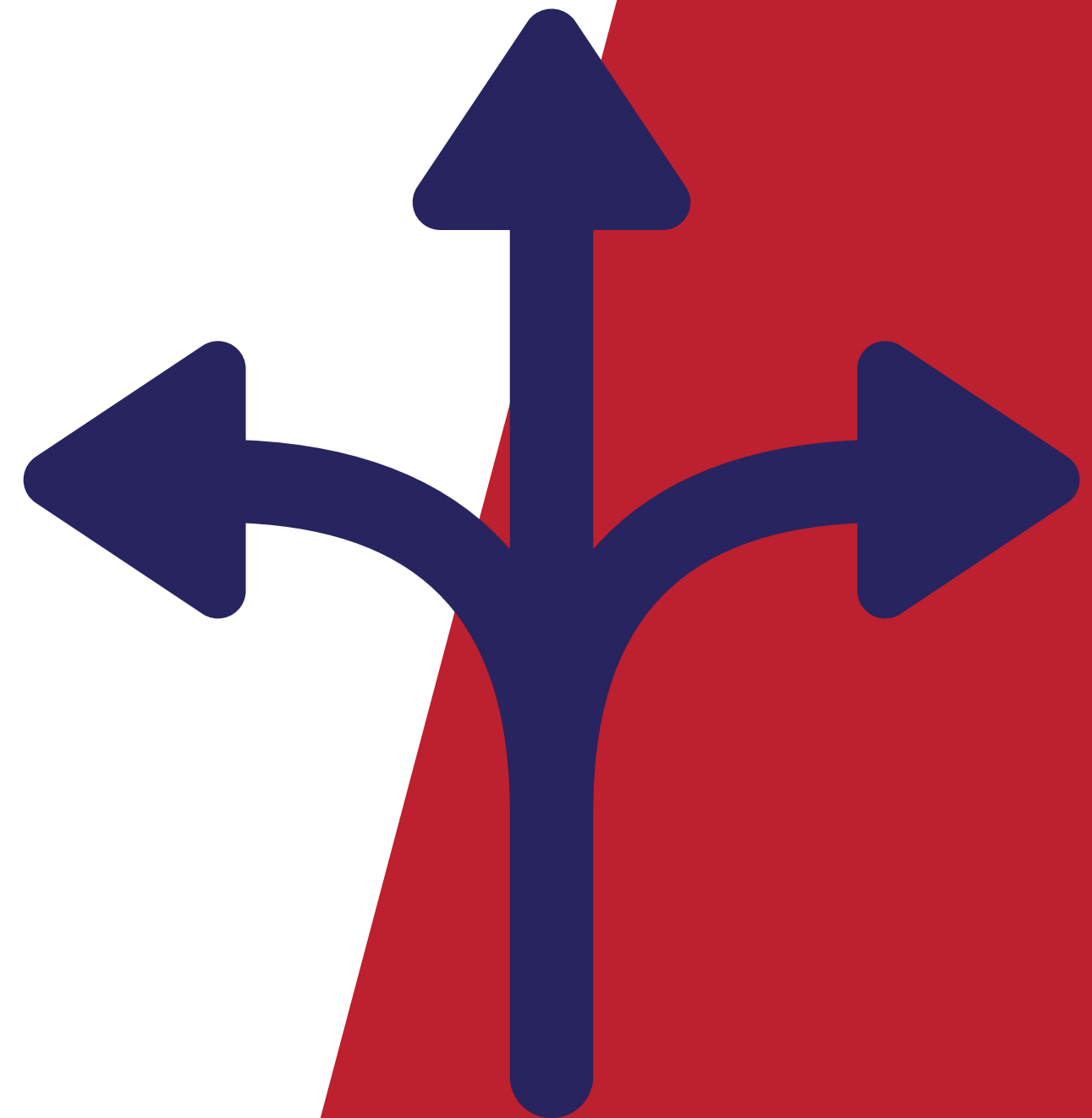

# VET in SACE

- Benefits of VET for SACE students:
  - it can provide a pathway straight into a trade after school and be taken as a substitute for other school subjects
  - it can enrich a student's SACE experience and provide them with valuable skills and qualifications, even if university is their preferred pathway
  - VET can be used as part of the flexible option in the university aggregate to calculate the ATAR
- Some of the courses that our students are currently undertaking are:

  - Cert III Agriculture (Dairy Production)
  - Cert III Business
  - Cert III Dance
  - Cert III Early Childhood Education

# **University Language, literacy and Mathematics Scheme - Adjustment Factors**

- All South Australian universities – Maximum 4
- Not applicable to Medicine or Veterinary Science
- Mathematics – Methods or Specialist = 2
- English – General or Literary Studies = 2  
(prerequisite for interstate university entry)
- LOTE = 2
