
What were your first impressions of Encounter Lutheran College? It is a really welcoming and supportive school and the students are really friendly and inviting.

PYP Exhibition

Last week there was much to celebrate in the Junior School as we presented this year's Year 6 PYP Exhibition to the wider school community. This special event is the culmination of learning that has been undertaken throughout the Junior School years.

The PYP Exhibition is process that challenges students to explore real-world issues that matter to them. Throughout the Exhibition process, students work collaboratively to investigate these issues from multiple perspectives, seeking solutions and exploring ways they can make a difference in their communities.

As many of you would know, at the heart of the PYP Exhibition lies inquiry. Our students had the freedom to select a topic related to the unit "Who We Are' to inquire into an area they felt passionate about. As with all good inquiry units, students started by formulating questions, investigating authentic sources, then gathering information to deepen their understanding of their chosen issue.

Taking Action - The PYP approach goes beyond acquiring facts; it emphasizes the significance of taking action in response to their learning. As part of the Exhibition process, students identified areas where they could contribute positively. Whether it's by raising awareness of their chosen issue, collaborating with local organisations or individuals, or changing their own behaviour as a result of their learning, our students show their commitment to becoming responsible global citizens.

Collaboration plays a pivotal role in the PYP Exhibition and also represents one the skills we seek to develop to prepare students for life beyond school. Students has opportunities to work in groups, using each other's strengths and perspectives to research and share their understanding of some complex issues. They learnt the value of active listening, empathy, and collective decision-making. Together, they worked through challenges and celebrated their achievements, strengthening their social and communication skills.



Communication - Effective communication is key to creating an impact. Our students learnt to share their ideas and discoveries confidently. They utilized various mediums such as presentations, interactive pieces and creative displays to share with the school community, parents, and invited guests during the Exhibition days. This opportunity also helped to develop public speaking and presentation skills. It takes courage to engage others!

Reflection - The PYP Exhibition is not just about the end result; it's about the process. Reflection is an integral part of this. Students were encouraged to consider their goals, challenges faced, and identify areas for improvement. Through self- assessment and feedback from teachers and peers, students gained a deeper understanding of themselves as learners.

The culmination of this incredible learning journey was the Exhibition. It's was indeed a celebration of their hard work, dedication, and creativity. As well as showcasing their knowledge and skills it hopefully inspired others to take action and create positive change in their own lives and communities. We really believe this is a critical point in your children's education and are already planning what it may look like for our next class of Year 6's.

Year 9 Flinders Camp

Last week the Year 9 boys ventured to the Flinders Ranges to participate in the second Year 9 camp week. They based themselves on a station 10kms South of Blinman called Gum Creek Station.

Tuesday consisted of mountain biking parts of the Flinders Bike Trail (the whole trail is 200kms in total) and a service component which included planting gum trees in and around Gum Creek Station to help Bill the station owner.

Wednesday the Year 9 boys walked in and around Wilpena Pound. Some of the walks the boys enjoyed included Wangara Lookout Hike, Bridle Gap Hike and the Boom and Bust hike.

Thursday the Year 9 boys took a walk back in time. Dr Felicity Coutts, an Ediacaran Palaeontologist gave an educational talk and walk through part of Brachina Gorge explaining the geological significance of the Flinders Ranges. Felicity showed the boys fossils of the Earth's oldest sponges, ancient Stromolites, using special putty to find fossils in rocks and a significant geological landmark called the Edicaran Golden Spike which showed a distinct rock formation indicating the end of the ice age. The boys are now all budding geologists after a very interesting and informative session.

Despite warm conditions the boys enjoyed experiencing the Flinders Ranges in several different ways.

Australian Mathematics Competition

Several of Encounter's Year 7 to Year 9 students sat the Australian Mathematics Competition about a month ago.

This involved sitting a mainly multiple choice (with some short answer) test for 75 minutes. We have just had the results and certificates returned.

The students who scored a <u>Proficiency</u> Certificate (a student received a pre-set score that would show they are competent at mathematical problem solving to Australian standards), a <u>Credit</u> Certificate (top 55-20%) or a <u>Distinction</u> Certificate (top 20-3%).
