
Star Performers

Dear Parents/Carers,

Last Friday, students in the Junior School participated in Outdoor Classroom Day. While we take many opportunities to take learning outdoors at Encounter, there was something pretty special about celebrating getting out of the classroom with 3 million other children around the world, who also took part in this international event.

The Outdoor Classroom Day campaign (formerly named Empty Classroom Day) began back in 2011 and over the span of more than a decade, has become the global movement it is today. It has continued to gain momentum as more and more families understand that spending time outdoors is as important for children's development as learning to read and write. It is key to improving children's health, wellbeing and happiness.

It is not just nice to have – it is essential for children's development.



According to Australian Health Guidelines, children require approximately 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity each day. Alarmingly, current data from the Australian Institute of Health and Wellbeing shows that by the age of 10 (Year 5/6) only 15% of children meet this standard!

So whether it is our littlest learners at Bush Kindy and Early Learning or our oldest Junior School students in Year 6, outdoor learning is a fundamental part of their experience in the Junior School at Encounter and is here to stay.

Visual Art Happenings







School Uniform Reminders

As we approach the end of year, it is important that our College uniform guidelines and expectations are adhered to. Please find below some <u>common</u> <u>clarifications</u> for our Middle and Senior School students.

- There is no 'summer' or 'winter' uniform it is now tran seasonal but must be College approved (ie: no long sleeve white t-shirts underneath short sleeve shirts). The formal uniform is either the skirt or shorts/pants with a shirt (with the addition of either jacket or blazer). The red dress is being discontinued at the end of this year, with a new optional new dress now available to purchase.
- For formal College occasions (e.g. photo days, Gratitude Dinner, etc), boys in Years 10-12 must wear long pants/trousers (and not shorts).
- The Blue shirts will also be discontinued at the end of this year, and must be worn tucked in.
- Only one earring may be worn in each ear (stud/ sleeper) and no clear piercings are allowed. No facial piercings, nor facial hair is allowed.

- Hair must not be touching the collar. If it touches the collar it must be tied up.
- Black leather school shoes must be worn with the uniform. Sneakers are only acceptable with the PE uniform, which is only to be worn on PE/Dance days (or Sport Science theory lessons)
- Navy socks/stockings are to be worn with the formal uniform. White socks (without logos) are only to be worn with PE uniform.
- Skirts/dresses should be knee length. (A 5cm variable will allow for seasonal growth.)
- Hats are required for Term 1 & 4 and must not be worn in classrooms.



Thank you so much for those of you who are leading by example in wearing the uniform correctly. You are a wonderful representation of the Encounter spirit.


