We departed on 10th July and headed to the Red Centre, stopping at Uluru, Kings Canyon, Standley Chasm, Simpson's Gap to name a few. I found myself in awe of the most beautiful colours of the outback, the sunsets, waterholes, walking trails. The natural beauty, the wildlife and the cultural history was amazing. We enjoyed many walks, hiking trails, and we did a sunset helicopter ride over Uluru and Kata Tjuta, we also enjoyed a sunset camel ride. I found myself reflecting on the creation of all these beautiful places, the formation and complexity of each and how over time things have changed for example our now desert places in the outback were once an inland sea, how blessed we were to be experiencing them.

Australia truly is a beautiful country, we were amazed at how rivers were dry on the surface, but only a couple of metres down and they were flowing, we were amazed at the lava tubes at Undara, the history of time etched into stone (the Poems at Coober Pedy) and the complex nature of the ecosystems in those dryer regions. We learnt about the gold rush era and the opal mining and how very harsh those living conditions were at that time.

Whilst we pray for peace and calm in other parts of our world, I thank God for our beautiful landscapes, how amazing is Australia and the beautiful country we have to explore and enjoy, the natural beauty and wonders and I thank God for our ability to relish in His creation.

Indigenous Naming of Block 69

WURAR RUWI

(Land of the Red Gum)

In 2019, Encounter Lutheran College purchased 69 acres of land, directly to the north of our property, bordering Adelaide and Waterport Roads and extending to the main roundabout into Victor Harbor. While we've affectionately referred to it as "Block 69" over this time, this parcel of land has become a special place for our College community as we commenced revegetating it, and have learnt more about the special significance that it has to our Aboriginal Elders.

Recently Encounter Lutheran College consulted with MIPAAC (Miwi Inyeri Pelepi Ambi Aboriginal Corporation), who deliberated with the Elders and linguists of our community to decide on a name for this block of land, to create a name that would accurately represent its environment.

On Wednesday 22 November, Encounter Lutheran College, together with the MIPAAC, gave Block 69 its new name.

That name is **Wurar Ruwi (Land of the Red Gum)**.

To honour this, we had a ceremony to acknowledge Ngarrindjeri as the original occupants and custodians of the land; to recognise the immense privilege that comes with this as well as create a new respectful bond between our cultures so we can walk together into the future.

During the ceremony we heard from some of our Aboriginal students, College leaders, linguist Maryanne Gale who explained the naming process, together with leaders and elders of the Ngarrindjeri community. Special thanks to Cedric Varcoe for MCing the ceremony and to all the Elders, Nunga community members, staff and students who attended and performed. We thank them for their collaboration and entrusting us with the knowledge of this Ruwi.

As custodians of this special country, we will continue to plant, nurture and revegetate. We will have outdoor learning, Bush Kindy and experiential opportunities. Our 2023 Student Leaders and incoming 2024 Student Leaders marked the occasion with tree plantings and were invited to join our special guests for a smoking ceremony and lunch.

Understanding and utilising indigenous language is integral to reconciliation and the hope for a shared future.


