In the future our hope is for Wurar Ruwi to be a rich learning environment, a dynamic habitat, a space for play and exploration and a reminder of what is possible when we make our planet a priority. outdoors and enrich learning and wellbeing. We also hope it will be a place where we can engage with community and invite them into the Encounter Family. The Wilderness Centre and all of Wurar Ruwi is a gift to be shared and a living legacy for all of us to embrace.

Turning our attention to Adelaide Road, our new Early Learning Centre will be known as The Lighthouse.

Importantly, a lighthouse serves as a beacon, a clear landmark, and something that provides safe passage for travel from one place to another. Lighthouses hold prominent positions and Encounter also finds itself at the entrance to Victor Harbor and has the opportunity to declare itself as a safe haven, a destination and a point of reference. I believe all of those messages resonate with who we are and what we want to be for our youngest learners at Encounter, as well as our broader community.



So, with Shrove Tuesday coming up on 13th February ...pancakes seemed a simple way to remind people that on Tuesday 24 February, it will be two years since the war in Ukraine started.



Lutheran schools across Australia will be holding a "Pancake Day for Ukraine" to support the children of war. In exchange for your pancake or bacon and egg burger, we simply ask for a **gold coin donation**.

#### Did you know...

- More than 6,500,000 people are displaced inside Ukraine (that's the entire population of Victoria!
- Almost 8,000,000 Ukrainian people are refugees in Europe
- Another 369,200 people are refugees beyond Europe
- Ukraine is ending a cold winter
- In Kharkiv, the temperature ranges from −1 to −8 degrees.

#### How we can help...

- \$548 = Emergency food / shelter / drinking water for a family of 4 for a month
- \$26 = Drinking water for a month
- \$32 = Child safe spaces for a month
- \$52 = Emergency Shelter for a family for a month
- \$21 = Learning support for a child for a month


