Camping Experiences

I am writing this to you from Robe as I take the opportunity to spend some time with the Year 7 students and the staff on our Robe camp. It is a great reminder of why camps are such an important element of teaching and learning at Encounter. Some of the activities on this camp include students joining together in team building activities in which collaboration and critical thinking help them work out the various problems they encounter in activities that are fun and engaging. Students have spent time at the beach learning to surf, but also learning how to be safe in the water, looking for the signs of any danger, and how to look out for and care for each other. They have also been bike ridina. practising how to ride confidently, along with how to fit a helmet, and how to care for the bike. Many of these things are life skills as we help our families raise confident and versatile young people.

Other advantages of camp experiences at Encounter include students learning how to navigate their way through an airport, helping to prepare meals or clean up, learning how to use public transport and to find their way around a city. They find resilience on long walks, they learn how to put up and pack up tent, how to manage their own clothes through a camp, they find new connections with different students and form friendships in unexpected places, and they learn that being away from home can be daunting and even a little scary, but they learn that they can do it. As parents and staff our goal is to encourage the students, to paint a positive picture of what camps look like, and then to celebrate the successes of being on camp.

Developing skills such as personal organisation, self awareness, team building, and resilience are all critical skills for the emerging future. The 2020 Report of the Review of Senior Secondary Pathways into Work, Further Education and Training recognises the range of skills and attributes young people need to thrive in a changing work world, including those gained from experiences outside the classroom.



Finally, another exciting event in the coming week is Sports Day. This is another opportunity for students to exercise, engage in some team spirit, to encourage each other, and to enjoy a day outdoors beyond the classroom. I look forward to seeing the fun, colours, and excitement of Sports Day.



Adopt a Spot Scheme

HINDMARSH RIVER TO OLIVER'S REEF

Encounter Lutheran College has just signed up to the "Adopt a Spot Scheme", a volunteer community group that aims to minimise waste entering the ocean through regular collection and removal of debris.

As part of the program, Encounter Lutheran College has adopted the beachfront from Hindmarsh River to Oliver's Reef where we will regularly undertake rubbish pick-ups that are recorded and photographed for its Facebook page at www.facebook.com/adoptaspotscheme

When each clean-up is completed, students will lay out all collected rubbish on tarp and record how many cigarette butts and plastic bottle lids collected. The students will then write a few words about what was found, and upload the images to the Adopt a Scheme Facebook page.

The scheme also asks the adopters to record how long they spend on their cleans and how many people participate.



The Encounter Junior School staff spend time at the beach after school earlier this week where they recorded the following:



"On February 27 at 4.00pm, 20 people spent 20 minutes cleaning the area between Hindmarsh River and Oliver's reef, 12 cigarette butts, 1 bottle top and an assortment of rubbish".

Sports Day 2024

FRIDAY 8TH MARCH 2024

Sports Day 2024 is being held on **Friday 8th March** at Encounter Lutheran College. Students are to arrive **at the College from 8.20am** in readiness for the official opening at 8.40am.

Students that have signed up for the 1500m are asked to be at the bottom oval ready for a 7.45am start.

In order to accommodate more track and field events this year, we have introduced a Pre-Sports Day program for Years 7-12. Students will sign up for these events as normal during Home Class. These will be conducted on Wednesday 6th March (please refer to the program).

ATTENDANCE

Junior School

All Junior School students should go **straight to their classroom at 8.20am**. Attendance will be taken at their classroom, and their teacher will then walk the students to their House tents on the bottom oval for the official opening at 8.40am.

Middle and Senior School (Year 7 – Open)

Middle/Senior School students are asked to arrive and go straight to their House tent on the bottom oval where they will sign in with one of the House teachers. Students need to remain in their House tent until the official opening. All student bags are to be stored in House tents. Lockers will be closed for the day.

TRANSPORT & COLLECTION TIMES

Buses

All bus students (Link SA & Encounter Bus) will be dropped off and picked up from Encounter Lutheran College as normal. Students catching the buses will be dismissed by 2.55pm from the bottom oval.

Foundation

Sports Day is usually a very tiring day for our Foundation students. Therefore, lunch will be from 12.00pm and they may be collected from 12.30pm, from their classroom. For parents unable to collect their children earlier, quiet activities will be set up in the classrooms for students to go on with.

Junior & Middle/Senior School

Students will be dismissed from the bottom oval by 3.05pm and may be collected as per a normal school day.

OSHC

Before and after school OSHC will run as normal. Students attending OSHC in the morning will be walked to the classrooms by OSHC staff so they can have their morning attendance recorded.

RECESS & LUNCH

The Foundation to Year 3 Sports Day Program has scheduled breaks. Older year levels will have time throughout the morning for recess. Please refer to the program.

Foundation to Year 4 students are to bring their own recess and lunch.

Year 5 and 6 students can either bring their own or purchase from the stalls listed below.

Middle/Senior School students will be able to purchase their own recess and lunch during the day during break times.

Please Note:

- Good to Go lunch orders will <u>NOT</u> be available on Sports Day.
- The P&F will unfortunately not be offering preorders to our younger Junior School students this year due to a shortage of volunteer help.

There will be a range of food available for purchase on the day, including:

- Parents & Friends sausage sizzle, soft drinks.

Specialist Basketball Program visits Victor Harbor Rec Centre

As the school continues to expand into triple streamed classes for Years 7-10, the demand for space in the Kondole is ever growing. Further growth in Specialist Basketball Program across both sub-programs (Intensive Training Program [ITP] and Development Program [DP]), has seen the Program decide to trial how we deliver Basketball to specific squads for Term 1.

ITP Squads began their Tuesday morning sessions at the Victor Harbor Recreation Centre. The Year 9/10 squad have traditionally used their Sports Science sessions during lessons 7 and 8 as their sole skills session, however, the Tuesday morning sessions will allow for additional focus on skill development, with the aim for all players to feel more comfortable with team concepts. This will assist our playing teams to better prepare for their competitions. Sports Science is an important aspect of the Year 9/10 program, it will continue use practical sessions to explore concepts



including movement strategies, data collection/analyse, methods to acquire skill (coaching), injury prevention, biomechanical diagnostics. This learning environment assists to prepare students for senior Physical Education (SACE) through an integrated approach in Basketball.
