What were you doing before coming to Encounter?

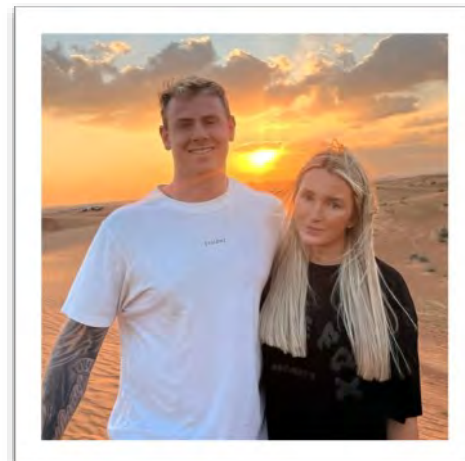

Embrace the boredom

Well, that is a wrap on Term 1!

Thanks to all parents who made time to come to Parent-Teacher interviews, either on Thursday afternoon/evening, or on Friday. At Encounter, we believe that parent-teacher interviews play a critical role in fostering a collaborative environment between home and school. These sessions serve as a platform for parents to share their concerns, aspirations, and insights regarding their child's progress. Equally important, they allow teachers to provide feedback on performance, behaviour, and how they are adjusting to a new year level. Now for a change in pace....

As you enjoy the break from getting children to school on time, the monotony of packing school lunches and remembering which day is library or PE, I wanted to take the opportunity to encourage you to let your children embrace boredom this holiday break.

While boredom can be mildly unpleasant, it is important that children are given the opportunity to feel (and be) bored. In fact, Trevor Mazzucchelli, Associate Professor of Clinical Psychology, Curtin University states that by not allowing our children to experience boredom, we deny them the chance to develop a number of critical skills including:

- the ability to tolerate less-than-ideal experiences
- manage frustration and regulate emotions
- creative thinking
- problem solving, planning, and organisation
- independence and self-sufficiency.

These skills are central to children developing a sense of control over their own happiness and well-being.



As child and adolescent therapist Kathy Hougaard-Lively writes:

"I find myself worrying most that when we hand our children phones (or allow them other technology), we steal their boredom from them. As a result, we are raising a generation of writers who will never start writing, artists who will never start doodling, young chefs who will never make a mess in their kitchen, athletes who will never kick a ball against the wall, musicians who will never pick up their dad's guitar and start strumming. Instead, we will create another generation of socially stunted young adults who are depressed, physically unhealthy and lacking motivation, imagination, and social skills.

Electronics serve a purpose, but are being abused by parents and children alike. Please do your kids a favour and teach them to live in the moment. Sometimes, it is ok to turn the electronics off."

So, these holidays?

Help your children to embrace the boredom and know that in so doing, you are actually helping them grow.

- Level 1 jobs require school completion, or a VET Certificate I or II.
- Level 2 jobs require a VET Certificate III or IV and may be attainable through an apprenticeship.
- Level 3 jobs require a VET Diploma or Advanced Diploma.
- Level 4 jobs usually require a VET or university Bachelor degree (or higher).

What is an Automotive Engineer?

What do Automotive Engineers do?
Automotive engineers are a specialised type of mechanical engineer. They design and manufacture vehicles and their subsystems, ensuring they meet safety, performance, and efficiency standards. They work on everything from engine design to aerodynamics, focusing on improving vehicle performance and functionality. They collaborate with teams to develop innovative solutions for transportation challenges, shaping the future of mobility. They need a deep understanding of vehicle dynamics, propulsion systems, and materials science.

What kind of course do I need to study to become an Automotive Engineer?

Engineering Associate:
2-year Advanced Diploma of Engineering Technology or Associate Degree of Engineering with a Mechanical major.

Engineering Technologist:
3-year Bachelor of Engineering Science or Technology with a Mechanical major.

Professional Engineer:
4-year Bachelor of Engineering with a Mechanical major.

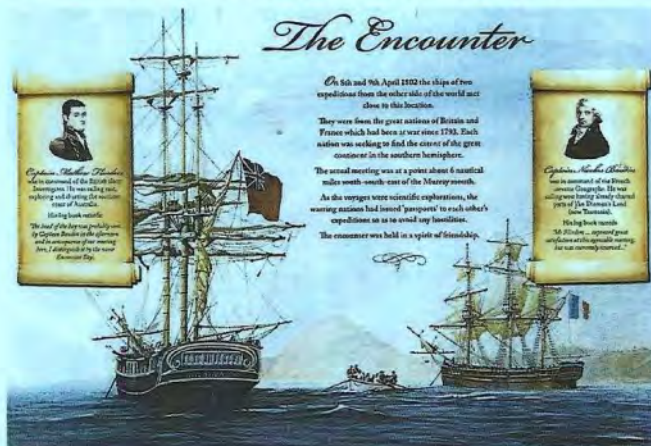
